

# A Little Background


- Grew up on a dairy/beef/row crop farm

- Picked blackberries on fencerows and pond dams etc...for cobblers





# Learning About Fruits/Berries


- Started working at the University of Arkansas in 1980

# Taking the Reigns of Fruit Breeding

- 16 years of program work before leadership of breeding effort in 1997 (at forty years old)
- Blending the past and the present..... and then building toward the future....that's the message





Getting Lucky in Blackberry Breeding – Double Blossom/Rosette, the Devastating Blackberry Disease in the South

- All Arkansas thorny varieties were susceptible, the 1983-released Shawnee maybe the worst
- The disease does not exist at the Arkansas Fruit Research Station, Clarksville, thus no screening for resistance possible
- No source of resistance known other than Humble from Texas....

# Where Was the Luck?

- Navaho, released in 1989, Arapaho in 1993
- Dr. Blair Buckley, located at the LSU Calhoun Research Station, testing
- Testing started in late 1990, evaluated 1992-94
- This is where resistance was discovered.....







# What Was the REAL Luck?

- Getting thornlessness and Double Blossom/Rosette resistance in one package
- We would likely not be in this room today without this resistance being identified....
- Is there a moral or message here?????
- In my career, always be looking and noticing.....



- A little University origin and funding background.....
- Grants? To do what? Breed fruits? Huh??!!!
- Dr Moore and the first patents and royalty income
- My expanding sights on royalty income to support breeding, 2001 or so....



- A few things happened:
  - Blackberry planting increased (more later)
  - Ouachita blackberry released 2003
  - Ozarkblue blueberry use expanded







- Plus, expanding cooperations in breeding and testing agreements
- Have someone pay to access testing or breeding rights and create program support back home
- Today's example: International Fruit Genetics and Cotton Candy table grape

#### History

- Initial discussion, David Cain, 2001
- First material exchange, 2002 (Cotton Candy's parent)
- Has moved the Arkansas grape breeding achievements into much broader use!
- And created much more value for the genetic assets and the future of Arkansas breeding

- I remember the day....about 2005 or 2006.....first seen by JRC
- Too much flavor David Cain says.....I say this is pretty good....
- A little soft, some color concern.....
- JRC really impressed with first-generation quality

- The message.....look out for what you dream about....




- Prior to 2004 or so, Arkansas blackberries were mainly local market, PYO and other uses (gardens)...
- For instance in the 1990s, Navaho sold approx. 70,000 plants per year compared to Ouachita in the 500,000 range in 2007



- My experience with Sunnyridge Farms
- First SRF presentation, 2002
- Planting began in the early 2000s, the beginning of the southern blackberry shipping industry


