

2024 Pesticide CEU/CCA Guide

THE FOLLOWING IS AN OVERVIEW OF EACH CEU/CCA CREDIT PROVIDER:

ALABAMA – Approved for 10 points in the categories of AP, D&R, and REG. Alabama applicators must attend a minimum of 240 minutes' worth of approved presentations to be awarded CEU credits. GEORGIA – Private Credit Hours for Category 10: 1 hour is equivalent to 1 credit.
Max of 2 private credit hours may be awarded.

Commercial Credit Hours for Category 21: 1 hour is equivalent to 1 credit.

The max per day is 5 credits even if more than 5 hours of education are attended per day.

NEW JERSEY – See the PESTICIDE CREDITS pages for approved educational sessions. Credits are based on attending an entire day commodity conference, not per session.
